Dear Parent/Guardian of Menomonee Falls 5K Student:

Beginning the week of October 15, children in the 5K kindergarten program will be participating in the Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening (PALS) assessment. This literacy assessment is a requirement of the state of Wisconsin and will be completed once in the fall and once again in the spring. This is the first year of the assessment and consists of tests in the following areas: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and vocabulary. The series of tests will be given over the course of the week of October 15<sup>th</sup> with about one of these short tests each day (see schedule below). If a child misses one of these days, times during the following week will be set aside to do the make-up. Total time that your child will be testing is about thirty minutes.

Monday, October 15	Group Rhyme Awareness Letter Recognition (1/2 of Class)
Tuesday, October 16	Group Beginning Sound Awareness Letter Recognition (1/2 of Class)
Wednesday, October 17	Individual Rhyme Awareness (if necessary) Letter Sounds
Thursday, October 18	Individual Beginning Sound Awareness (if necessary) Spelling
Friday, October 19	COW Word Recognition in Isolation (optional)
